

Teen pregnancy rates are triple the Quebec average.




Compared to the average provincial rate, <u>Chlamydia</u> among youth is 8x to 9x higher <u>Gonorrhoea</u> is 6x higher


These higher rates of STIs are a big concern because a community severely affected by STIs is at a higher risk of being affected by HIV/AIDS

Community members wanted to create a Cree program to address these issues.



Many partners worked together to make it possible





•The program was created with suggestions from youth, Elders, teachers and community members.

 It was pilot tested in two communities and then modified by a Working Group



The final version of the program is more culturally sensitive and better adapted to the ways of learning of the youth.





Chii kayeh iyaakwaamiih means "you too, be careful".


This name reflects the spirit of the program: To encourage youth to care not only for their own wellbeing but for that of others too.

✓ It is for secondary 3 (50 hours/year)
 ✓ Or secondary 4 students (2 Credit course)

Team work




Connecting to Cree values and culture

Healthy sexuality

- Wrap up: Students apply what they have learned in every days situations






What is the program about? What are the strong points?

Respects the characteristics of <u>effective</u> schoolbased programs on sexual health

Develops the factors that to lead to both <u>success in school and</u> <u>good health</u> (such as self-esteem and social skills)

What are some of the challenges? Implementation timeline



What are some of the challenges? Main challenges

Making sure the program is maintained, implemented and supported properly

- The program is not offered in all the schools every year
- The parents' committee and the community are not well informed
- Youth are not always receiving the program in the best way
- •The teachers are often uncomfortable with the cultural components
- •The tools provided are not always used
- •The aashuumiih (team work and sharing) is not always done

What could be done? File holder/team at local level



To make sure the program stays in the school

- Help to pass a resolution of the parents' committee
- Stay informed on how the program is doing
- Promote the program in the community

What could be done? File holder /team at local



- To ensure program's given in the best possible way
 - Make sure teachers have materials
 - Support lessons with Cree cultural components, on STIs, condoms, contraception, unhealthy relationships
 - Support students during projects

What is being done? **Dublic Health at the regional level**



- Provides materials to teachers and meets new teachers when requested
- Monitors the program
- Supports the local file holder/team Provides Implementation Guide & materials
- Offers training to local teams and teachers
